- 2- Employment Centers need to be incentivized for wide-spread deployment of EV charging infrastructure.
- 3- Multi-unit housing units need to be incentivized for wide-spread deployment of EV charging infrastructure
- 4- There needs to be DCFC infrastructure along high travel corridors
- 5- New construction needs to be 100% (not 3%) EVSE ready, meaning conduit laid.
- 6- Finally, free charging sucks; it creates a sense of entitlement and is not sustainable. I wrote an article for an online magazine about this (links below). There needs to be education among EV drivers that public charging infrastructure is not selling energy, but is selling access to energy.
