## Agenda

The purpose of this workshop is to receive presentations from POUs required to file IRPs with the Energy Commission pursuant to SB 350 (de León, Chapter 547, Statutes of 2015). These presentations should discuss:

• Ongoing IRP efforts and processes being undertaken by the state's POUs;



- How state energy and environmental policies are incorporated into IRPs and procurement decisions; and
- How the guidelines, filings and the review process can be designed and/or implemented so as to both leverage ongoing and anticipated POU planning efforts and facilitate meeting the state's energy and environmental goals.

## Background

Senate Bill 350 requires the Energy Commission to produce guidelines for and to review IRPs from POUs. Those POUs with an average load greater than 700 GWh (in the 2013-16 period) are required to adopt IRPs and submit them to the Energy Commission by January 1, 2019, and update them at least once every five years thereafter. Based on historical data, 16 POUs are expected to be required to file an IRP. The Energy Commission may review and advise on the plans, and may adopt guidelines to "govern the submission of information" for this review.

IRPs are comprehensive electricity system planning documents intended to ensure that POUs lay out the resource needs, policy goals, physical and operational constraints, and general priorities or proposed resource choices of an electric utility, including customer-side preferred resources. These plans will provide a framework to evaluate how utilities have chosen to align with greenhouse gas emission (GHG) reduction targets as well as energy and other policy goals outlined in Senate Bill 350, including but not limited to:

- Reductions in electricity sector GHG emissions commensurate with economywide reductions of 40 percent from 1990 levels by 2030;
- A renewables portfolio standard of 50 percent by 2030; and
- Energy efficiency, gas use efficiency and vehicle electrification targets

## **Public Comment**

Oral comments. The Lead Commissioner will accept oral comments during the workshop. Comments may be limited to three minutes per speaker. Any comments will become part of the public record in this proceeding.
