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# Public Health - PSA

Staff's evaluation of health impacts of the proposed project includes:

- environmental and regulatory setting
- project toxic air contaminants (TACs): exposure pathways: inhalation, home grown produce, dermal absorption, soil ingestion, fish ingestion and mother's milk
- analysis of the project's potential human health risks associated with TACs emissions:

Construction/demolition: asbestos, fugitive dust, diesel particulate matter (DPM) and Valley fever

Operation: TACs from Puente, MGS Unit 3 and Unit 1 (temporary)

mitigation measures/ recommended conditions of certification



# Public Health - PSA

### Preliminary conclusions and recommendations:

- Project would comply with laws and standards
- No significant health impacts from project's toxic air emissions during:
  - construction
  - demolition of Mandalay Unit 1 and 2
  - operation of Puente
- Recommended conditions in Air Quality ensure compliance with standards and project impacts are less than significant



# Public Health - PSA

### **Environmental Justice:**

- Sensitive subpopulation in health risk assessment (HRA):
  - Infants
  - the elderly
  - people with pre-existing health conditions
- No one would experience any significant cancer, acute or chronic non-cancer health effects during construction, operation, or demolition
- No disproportionate public health impacts to off-site individuals and identified environmental justice populations
