## **Shut Down Aliso Canyon**

As a concerned member of the public and a Los Angeles gas utility ratepayer who has been following this situation for months, I know this facility needs to be shut down permanently. While I could not attend the meeting today due to it being inconveniently located in Diamond Bar, far away from the community most affected by the outcome of today's workshop, I have little faith that the Winter Reliability report will be any more factual than the Summer Reliability report. Thanks to groups like Food & Water Watch and Consumer Watchdog, it was exposed that SoCal Gas was allowed to write portions of the summer reliability report with no oversight. SoCal Gas stands to make hundreds of millions of dollars in profit from this facility - they are not willing to provide impartial evidence when making the case for reopening the facility. Opening this facility back up comes at great cost to our climate and the health of the community that is burdened by air pollution from the constantly leaking wells. We cannot afford to re-open Aliso Canyon - it's an aging facility that will only continue to cost us ratepayers millions in upkeep while allowing SoCal Gas to profit from storage fees.
