I was working in Pacoima at the time and it was VERY evident on days with little wind. ALL of LA county was exposed to potential ill health effects and long term health consequences that may contribute to early death. It's not like these toxic gases when up into the air and disappeared. I can't believe you haven't admitted that EVERYONE was exposed. Why did it take activists to measure the gas levels on the ground around the valley?

The unwillingness of government officials to issue warnings and publicly publish AND monitor gas levels in real time online is a dereliction of duty.
