Background

The Renewables Portfolio Standard (RPS) was established by Senate Bill 1078 (Sher, Chapter 516, Statutes of 2002), effective January 1, 2003, with revisions to the law following as a result of Senate Bill 1250 (Perata, Chapter 512, Statutes of 2006), Senate Bill 107 (Simitian, Chapter 464, Statutes of 2006), and Senate Bill X1 2 (Simitian, Chapter 1, Statutes of 2011, First Extraordinary Session). By December 31, 2020, the

law requires retail sellers of electricity and POUs to increase the amount of eligible renewable energy resources they procure to 33 percent of their retail sales. Under the law, the Energy Commission is required to certify eligible renewable energy resources that may be used by retail sellers of electricity and POUs to satisfy their RPS procurement requirements, develop an accounting system to verify POU retail seller compliance with the RPS, and adopt regulations specifying procedures for enforcement of the RPS for the POUs.

The Energy Commission adopted the *Enforcement Procedures for the Renewables Portfolio Standard for Local Publicly Owned Electric Utilities (Regulations)* at its June 12, 2013, Business Meeting.
