## Re: Comments on Docket Number 16-IEPR-02 - Natural Gas

Dear Chair Weisenmiller,

On behalf of the Los Angeles County Business Federation (BizFed) – a massive, diverse grassroots alliance of more than 160 business organizations representing 325,000 employers with 3 million employees throughout LA County – we are writing to express our concerns about the very real risks we will face if the Aliso Canyon storage facility remains offline. Whether it's risking cold classrooms for our region's 640,000 school children or facing electrical interruptions at our region's 100 hospitals, it is imperative that Aliso Canyon be brought back online in a manner that is as safe as it is timely to ensure energy reliability in the region.

Southern California Gas Company has a long history of working with the electric utilities and grid operators to manage the interdependency between natural gas and electric generation. However, that important relationship depends on a constant and reliable supply of natural gas to fuel electric generation. Our region's 11 million people and thousands of businesses also rely on Aliso Canyon for basic heating and cooling every day throughout the LA Basin. During the forthcoming peak in natural gas consumption during winter months, we could face increased risk of shortages.

Reliable, affordable energy and a thriving economy are the best means to support middle class job creation. California's economic competitiveness declines as our energy, transportation, and fuel costs rise relative to our competitors. Because Aliso Canyon stores 62% of all natural gas in the LA Basin, any natural gas shortages would place a disproportionate burden on many middle and lower income families who could face increased energy costs.

Rather than settling for a quick fix, or giving in to emotional pleas to shut Aliso Canyon down, now is the time to do the hard work required to get Aliso Canyon functioning. Please take this threat to our economy seriously and work to restore the Aliso Canyon natural gas storage facility as soon as possible.
