Background

On December 30, 2015, Mission Rock Energy Center, LLC (Applicant) submitted the Application to the Energy Commission seeking permission to construct and operate the Proposed Project: a 275-megawatt simple-cycle, natural-gas-fired power generation facility. The Proposed Project would also include construction of a new 6.6-mile, 230 kilovolt transmission line and a new 2.4-mile, 16-inch diameter pipeline that would connect to Southern California Gas Company's existing high-pressure natural-gas transmission pipeline (Line 404/406).

The Proposed Project would be located on approximately 10 acres in an existing industrial park at 1025 Mission Rock Road in unincorporated Ventura County, approximately five miles west of downtown Santa Paula, California. For sanitary needs, the Proposed Project would use potable water from the City of Santa Paula via an existing on-site connection.

For power plant cooling, process water would be recycled water from the Limoneira Company's wastewater treatment facility. Use of recycled water for cooling would also require purification equipment and a storage tank for the purified water. Industrial wastewater from cooling tower blowdown and other operational processes would be discharged to an existing pipeline.

If approved, construction of the proposed Project is expected to occur over a 17-month period (from November 2018 through April 2020). Commercial operation of the Proposed Project is projected for September 2020.
