 My name is Irene Valencia, and I live at 2400 E. Pleasant Valley Road, Space 98, Oxnard CA. I have lived in Oxnard my whole life, and at this address about 19 years. Professionally, I am in the mental health field, working with K-12 students who have social-emotional issues. Because I am regionally based, not assigned to a specific school, I have the opportunity to interact with people throughout the area.

I am concerned about pollution impacts on my community, my family and on me. I feel that living in Oxnard, we are exposed to significant amounts of pollution.

My family is very much affected by asthma. When I was growing up, my aunt and uncle lived in Port Hueneme by the Ormond Beach plant. For the last decade or so, they have lived at 5th Street & S. Victoria Avenue, close to where Edison Mandalay plants are, and where the new NRG plant would be. My three cousins, who are 20, 18 and 15, all have asthma. The two older girls were diagnosed with asthma early on, when they were about three years old. The family had to care for their condition, and I remember hospitalization incidents. The youngest sister started having respiratory problems about five years ago. All three attended school in Oxnard, including Oxnard High.

My cousins love to play at the beach. I have seen them riding their bikes right off 5th Street, where the Mandalay plants are. I am concerned about the amount of pollution they are exposed to, living and going to school near the plants.

The part of Oxnard where I live is surrounded by agricultural fields. The junior high I attended, especially the track where we ran, was adjacent to agricultural fields where pesticides were being spread. My sister and mother both suffer from severe allergies, and I suffer from migraines. While many attribute migraines to stressful work conditions, my migraines started before I got into the field of mental health. I strive to control the stress levels I experience, and to live a healthy life, but I can't control the pollution in the air I breathe.

I have considerable experience working with families throughout the region. I interact regularly with children in Ventura County: Ojai, Simi Valley, Fillmore, Westlake Village as well as Oxnard. My assessment is that, compared to the region as a whole, Oxnard communities are very underserved in health care, mental health and education. Rather than a new gas-fired power

plant, Oxnard needs investment in more services for families that are going to positively impact their well-being. There are real benefits from relying on renewable energy. Rather than investing in something that is only going to negatively impact the community, I believe we need investment in educating the community in ways they can live healthy lives.
