

The NRG Ellwood Generating Station uses two natural gas-fired, simple cycle combustion turbines to turn a generator with a maximum capacity of 54 MW. It began operation in 1973. The facility is maintained and operated by employees at the Mandalay Generating Station.

Community Involvement

Employees are very active in the community, donating to various fundraisers and charities. They have preserved a relationship with the Goleta Rotary Club for more than a decade and have supported the Goleta Rotary-sponsored graffiti abatement program. The station also participates in the Salvation Army's Adopt an Angel program.

Environmental Responsibility

Each of the combustion turbines is equipped with a dry low-NOx combustor to reduce nitrogen oxide emissions. The plant also has an ongoing recycling program to support sustainability goals.

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
