Background

Under the RPS, the Energy Commission is responsible for certifying eligible renewable energy resources that may be procured by retail sellers of electricity and local publicly owned electric utilities (POUs) to satisfy their RPS requirements, and for developing an accounting system to verify their procurement. The *RPS Eligibility Guidebook* describes the eligibility requirements and processes for certifying renewable resources as RPS eligible and describes how the Energy Commission will track and verify RPS compliance.

The following are proposed non-substantive changes to the Renewable Portfolio Standard (RPS) Eligibility Guidebook, Ninth Edition. In the following proposed non-substantive changes, additions are shown in underline and deletions are shown in strikeout font.

These changes are anticipated to be adopted by resolution at the April 27, 2017, Business Meeting. Following adoption, all changes will be integrated into the *Renewables Portfolio Standard Eligibility Guidebook, Ninth Edition (Revised).*

- 1. <u>Removal of Field Codes</u>: All field codes, which were previously included to support the creation of an Index of Terms have been removed. No changes in text resulted from the removal of field codes.
- <u>Correction of Typographical Errors on Page Number ii:</u> The following change on Page ii is as follows (added text is underlined and deleted text is shown in strikethrough):

For facilities meeting or exceeding all minimum thresholds for each environmental area, the submission of a simple explanation documenting how development and operation of the facility do not cause or contribute to a violation of California LORS is sufficient. If the facility does not meet all the minimum thresholds for a particular environmental area, the applicant must provide the following for that environmental area:

- A comprehensive list and description of all California LORS relating to the environmental area that may be directly or indirectly violated by the development or operation of the facility.
- An assessment of whether the development or operation of a facility will cause or contribute to a violation of any California LORS in the region of California most likely to be affected by the development or operation of the facility.
- 3) Documentation substantiating the applicant's assessment as required in b2) above. For example, documentation could include environmental studies, permits, and similar materials demonstrating that the development or operation of the facility will not cause or contribute to a violation of California LORS in California.

6. <u>Correction of Typographical Error on Page Number 42</u>:

The Energy Commission developed the RPS Online System for the RPS program to streamline the RPS certification application and reporting processes. This chapter provides an overview of the RPS Online System, including the account management, certification application, and reporting processes. Instructions on how to use the RPS Online System will be made available within the RPS Online System.

10. <u>Correction of Typographical Error on Page Number 50:</u> The following change on Page 50 in Chapter 5 is as follows (added text is underlined):

(3) Revisions to the Eligibility Date

The eligibility date for a facility may be revised for several reasons. If the eligibility date is revised, the applicant will be notified of the new eligibility date. The eligibility date will be revised if any of the following occurs:

- a) Denial of an application or the revocation of an existing RPS certification.
- b) Changes in the operations of the facility from the planned operations or actual operations as indicated in a previous application. (See Chapter 5.B.1: <u>Substantial</u> Amendments.)
- c) Withdrawal of the RPS certification of a facility or removing a facility from an aggregated unit, affecting only the removed facility.
- d) Failure to submit an amended RPS certification or precertification application within 180 days of a change requiring an amendment. (See Chapter 5.B: Amending an RPS Certification.)

11. <u>Correction of Typographical Error on Page Number 52 and 53:</u> The following change on Page 52, continuing to Page 53 in Chapter 5 is as follows (deleted text is shown in strikethrough) in order to remove an obsolete chapter reference:
