COMMITTEE SCHEDULING ORDER

Background

On October 26, 2016, Stanton Energy Reliability Center, LLC (Applicant), submitted an Application for Certification (AFC) to the California Energy Commission (Energy Commission) seeking approval to construct and operate the Stanton Energy Reliability Center (SERC), a 98-megawatt (MW) hybrid electrical generating and battery energy storage facility at 10711 Dale Avenue, Stanton, Orange County, California.

On March 8, 2017, the Energy Commission determined the AFC to be complete and designated a Committee of two Commissioners¹ to conduct proceedings on the AFC. On April 17, 2017, the Committee conducted a public Site Visit, Informational Hearing and Environmental Scoping Meeting in Stanton, California to discuss the review process and to identify issues that could affect the schedule.

Information regarding the status of the project, how to sign-up to receive automated email notifications, as well as notices and other relevant documents pertaining to this proceeding, may be found on the Energy Commission's Internet web page at: http://www.energy.ca.gov/sitingcases/stanton.

Scheduling Order

Pursuant to California Code of Regulations, title 20, section 1709.7(c), the attached Committee Schedule considers the Energy Commission Staff's proposed schedule and the related discussions with the parties at the Informational Hearing.

The Committee hereby adopts the attached Committee Schedule. The parties are to consider this schedule an outer boundary and make their best efforts to complete the milestones ahead of these dates. Some deadlines may be contingent upon reviews and

analyses to be conducted by federal, state, and local agencies. The Applicant must provide sufficient review time for the responsible agencies to meet the deadlines specified in the schedule.

The Committee may modify the schedule at any time upon either its own motion or that of a party. (Cal. Code Regs., tit. 20, § 1709.7(c)).

Status Reports and Conferences

The Committee requires periodic status reports to be submitted by all parties to determine whether case development is progressing satisfactorily and to bring potential schedule delays or other relevant matters to the Committee's attention. The burden is on the Applicant to produce the necessary data according to the schedule.

To facilitate the process, each party shall serve and file a status report on May 15, 2017 and on the 15th day of every month thereafter until directed otherwise by the Committee. Parties must file (docket) documents using the e-filing system on the Energy Commission's website, by selecting the "Submit e-Filing" link in the "Original Proceeding" box at: http://www.energy.ca.gov/sitingcases/stanton.

Public Adviser and Public Participation

The Energy Commission invites members of the public and other interested parties to participate either on an informal basis or by intervening in the proceeding. Both types of participation allow written and oral comments. At the informal participation level, written and oral public comments are considered by the Commissioners and are part of the record, but are not part of the formal evidentiary record. At the formal participation level, Intervenors have the right to introduce evidence into the evidentiary record and cross-examine the other parties' witnesses.

The Energy Commission's Public Adviser's Office is available to provide the public with an understanding of the proceedings and to make recommendations for meaningful participation.
