Notice to Availability of Workbook on Proposed SB 350 2030 Energy Efficiency Savings Doubling Goal

On January 23, 2017, the California Energy Commission and California Public Utilities Commission conducted a joint agency workshop to discuss key questions in the implementation of the energy efficiency portions of Senate Bill 350, the Clean Energy and Pollution Reduction Act of 2015 (de León, Chapter 547, Statutes of 2015). A workbook containing the source data for the proposed SB 350 2030 energy efficiency savings doubling targets is now available at

http://www.energy.ca.gov/2017_energy_policy/documents/#01232017. The Energy Commission is publishing this information to clarify the sources of data used to establish the SB 350 2030 energy efficiency doubling goal.

Consistent with the policy timeline and framework laid out in the January 23, 2017, workshop, these proposed SB 350 2030 energy efficiency savings targets, based on a literal doubling of statewide energy efficiency savings, will not need to be updated over time. Energy efficiency savings targets currently being developed by staff and based on cost effectiveness evaluations, feasibility, and impact on public health and safety, will be posted at a later date for comment and will be revised every two years.

How to Submit Written Comments

If you are interested in commenting on the workbook, written comments should be submitted to the Dockets Unit by **5:00 p.m. on May 24, 2017**. All written comments will become part of the public record of this proceeding.
