Notice of IEPR Staff Webinar on Light-duty Plug-in Electric Vehicle Calculator Tool for Publicly Owned Utility Integrated Resource Plans

California Energy Commission staff will conduct a webinar to discuss inputs and assumptions in a spreadsheet-based calculator proposed for publicly owned utility (POU) use in estimating the greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions impact of light-duty plug-in electric vehicle deployment assumed in their integrated resource plans (IRP). This webinar is being conducted as part of the 2017 Integrated Energy Policy Report (2017 IEPR) proceeding. Chair Robert B. Weisenmiller is the Lead Commissioner for the 2017 IEPR. Background

California Public Resources Code Section 25301 requires the Energy Commission to prepare an *IEPR* every two years that includes assessments and forecasts of all aspects of energy industry supply, production, transportation, delivery and distribution, demand, and prices. In addition, Senate Bill 350 (De León, Chapter 547, Statutes of 2015) requires qualifying POUs to adopt IRPs at least once every five years. SB 350 allows the Energy Commission to adopt guidelines to govern the submission of information, data, and reports needed to support the Energy Commission's review of the IRPs. It also amends Section 701.1 of the Public Utilities Code to read that "a principal goal of electric and natural gas utilities' resource planning and investment shall be to encourage the diversity of energy sources through... widespread transportation electrification," and requires that the plan address procurement of transportation electrification.

In order to assist the utilities in estimating the impact of light-duty plug-in electric vehicles (LDPEV) on GHG emissions from both transportation and electric sectors, Energy Commission and

California Air Resources Board have developed a spreadsheet-based calculator for suggested use. This calculator contains embedded assumptions regarding the fuel use and operating characteristics of both LDPEVs and (displaced) gasoline-powered vehicles and their evolution through 2030. These assumptions, when combined with utility projections regarding the number of LDPEVs deployed and the GHG emissions content of the electricity supplied to charge them, will determine the resulting net GHG emissions reductions.

Agenda

The webinar will discuss staff's guidance on calculator use and review the inputs and assumptions that affect estimated GHG reductions from LDPEV deployment on the transportation side and GHG emissions increases on the electricity side. This is the first step in developing draft guidance for POU IRPs regarding estimating the impact of LDPEV deployment on GHG emissions. The discussion will be interactive, with staff introducing proposed guidance, followed by a public comment period. The webinar will conclude with a schedule for moving forward with the development of draft guidelines.
