



### 3 OBJECTIVES + REQUIRED GOALS

#### 1. Achieve Significant Reductions in Greenhouse Gas Emissions.

Establish a greenhouse gas reduction Goal for the Project Area that meets or exceeds a path toward long-term emissions reductions aligned with State goals.

#### 2. Improve Public Health and Environmental Benefits.

Establish a minimum of three Goals to improve public health outcomes for community residents and achieve environmental benefits for the Project Area.

#### 3. Expand Economic Opportunity and Shared Prosperity.

Establish a minimum of three Goals for workforce training, employment and local business expansion for the Project Area.
