\$78 million for grants

Greenhouse Gas Reduction Fund

Eligible applicants: city, county, special district, nonprofit organization, JPAs

75% of funds available to projects located in, and that provide benefits to, disadvantaged communities (pursuant to SB 535)

Acquisition and development projects



Urban greening transforms the built environment into **parks** and **places** that are more **sustainable**, **enjoyable**, and effective in creating **healthy** communities.

Thoughtful design

Reflects community need and vision

Uses natural solutions

Creates connections

All projects must **reduce greenhouse gas emissions** by including at least one of the following components:

1. Tree planting to sequester carbon
2. Tree planting to shade buildings to reduce building energy use
3. Constructing bicycle paths, bicycle lanes, or pedestrian facilities to reduce vehicle miles travelled.
