Urban greening transforms the built environment into parks and places that are more sustainable, enjoyable, and effective in creating healthy communities.

All projects must **reduce greenhouse gas emissions** by including at least one of the following components:

- 1. Tree planting to sequester carbon
- 2. Tree planting to shade buildings to reduce building energy use
- 3. Constructing bicycle paths, bicycle lanes, or pedestrian facilities to reduce vehicle miles travelled.
