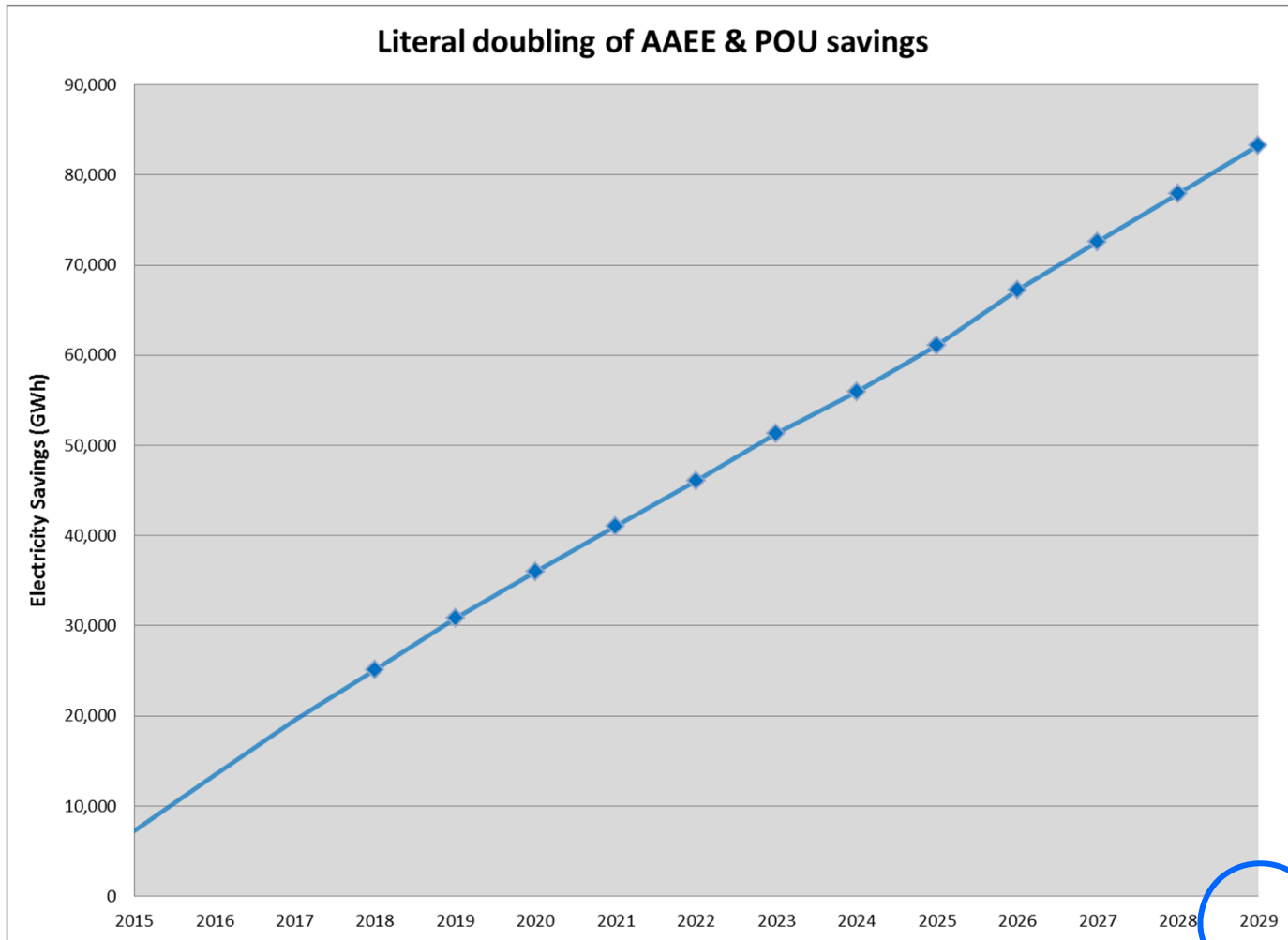
## SB 350 Energy Efficiency Savings Targets: Framework Updates

- Doubling Statewide EE: “*by January 1, 2030*”
- Doubling Statewide EE: extrapolation of expected EE savings to 2030
- Doubling Statewide EE: no corrections needed to 2014 AAEE



## SB 350 EEx2 - Framework Updates

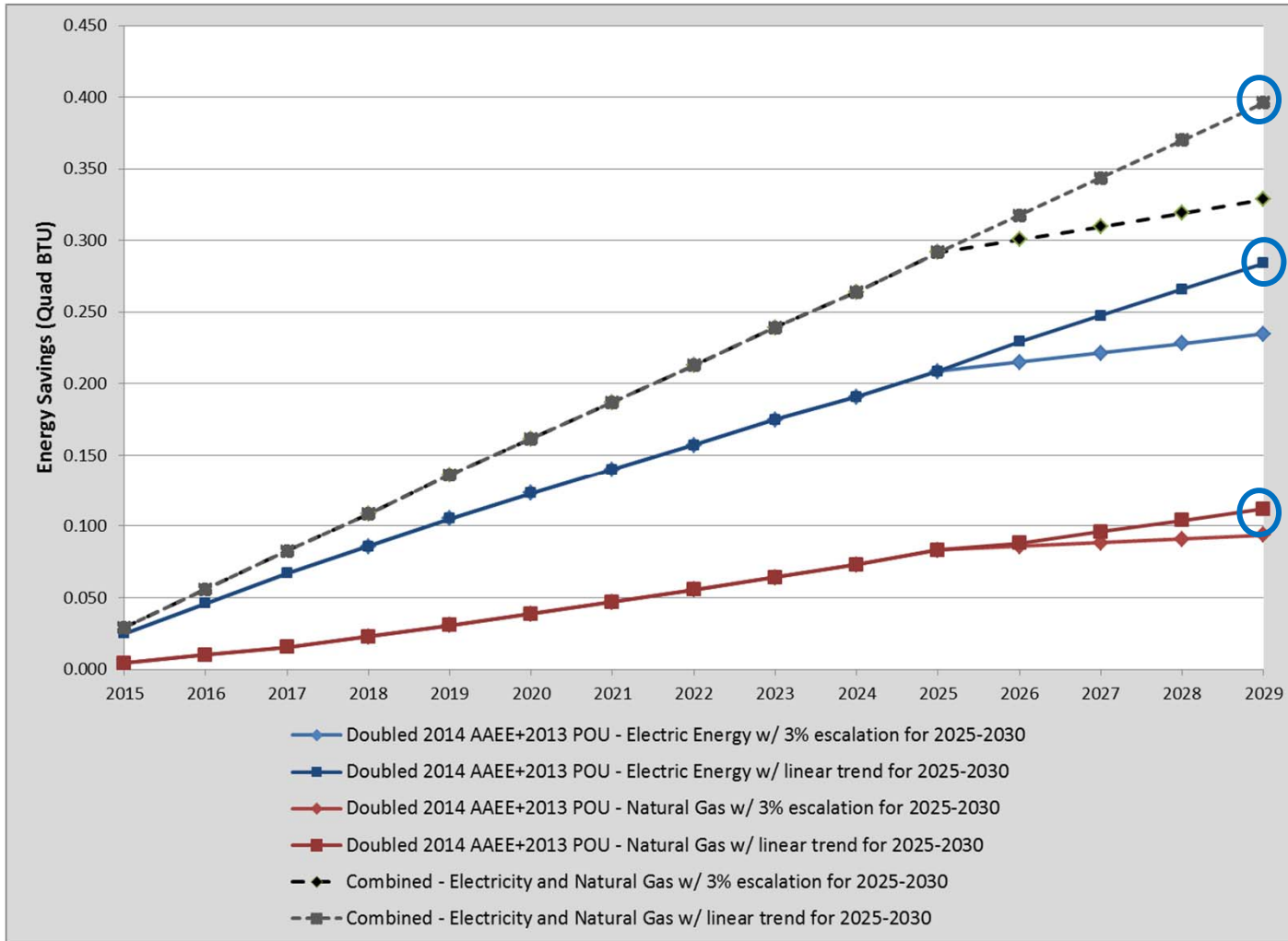
*“by January 1, 2030” == end of 2029*

## SB 350 EEx2 - Framework Updates

### no corrections needed to 2014 AAEE

- SB 350 specifies the use of 2014 AAEE
- SB 350 did not direct us to correct 2014 AAEE based on better information
- $(2014 \text{ AAEE} + 2013 \text{ POU goals}) \times 2 = \text{statewide annual efficiency goals}$
- Establishing annual EE targets that are cost-effective, feasible, and will not adversely impact public health & safety is the work SB 350 directs us to undertake
- We will compare the EE targets to the statewide annual EEx2 goals, track progress and provide recommendations over time
