## **Background**

Senate Bill 110, (Chapter 55, Statutes of 2017), allocates funding for three programs to be administered by the Energy Commission: 1) Up to \$75 million to be provided to school districts and county offices of education for grants or loans for school bus retrofit or replacement; 2) Up to \$100 million on a competitive basis for low or no-interest ECAA-Ed loans for eligible energy projects; and 3) Any remaining funds are allocated to a new Proposition 39 K-12 competitive grant program for local education agencies for energy efficiency and energy generation projects.

Staff from the Energy Commission, Fuels and Transportation Division, will discuss a draft concept under consideration for a solicitation on the school bus replacement program.
