- Minor clarification of ATT/ATE decertification process:
  - ATTCPs must describe their process for a decertified ATT or ATE seeking recertification including eligibility requirements (if any).
  - ATTCPs <u>may</u> specify additional qualifications for participation in their programs, such as limiting participation to persons that are not currently listed as "decertified" by another ATTCP.
- Standardized use of the terms ATT, ATE, and ATTCP.
- Minor modifications to the reporting requirements for ATTCPs.
- Minor modifications to the application amendment process for ATTCPs.

### §10-103.1 & .2 – (Continued)

#### **Quality Assurance Requirements**

- § 10-103.1(c)3F Lighting Controls No Changes
  - The ATTCP must perform a random sample of no less than one percent of each ATT's acceptance tests.
  - The ATTCP must perform randomly selected on-site audits of no less than one percent of each ATT's completed acceptance tests.
- § 10-103.2(c)3F Mechanical Systems Substantive Changes
  - The ATTCP must perform a random sample of no less than one percent of each ATT's acceptance tests.
  - The ATTCP must randomly select and shadow audit no less than one percent of each ATE's overseen projects, following the assigned ATT and observing their performance on the job site.
