Dear Energy Commission Staff:

I respectfully submit this letter to the California Energy Commission to state my dismay about the decision to exclude Solar PV Systems from the Home Energy Rating System (HERS) inspection process in the 2019 Title 24 Code. As a professional in the residential construction industry, I understand the value and importance of comprehensive HERS inspections to ensure homes operate at maximum efficiency to save energy, save the homeowner money over time and ultimately ensure the best possible residence is constructed.

Experience in the field has shown that shading issues are not always properly modeled and neighboring structures that impact solar performance are common. In addition, industry shifts from central inverters to micro-inverters necessitates proper programming of the micro-inverters to ensure they are reporting and communicating accurately with the web boxes.

We feel it is imperative that solar is recognized as a major energy system and be afforded a mandatory HERS inspection in the upcoming 2019 code cycle.
