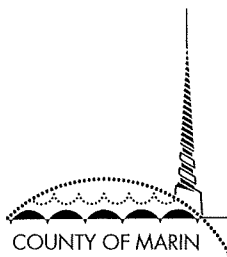

Dear Ingrid,

In accordance with Public Resources Code Section 25402.1(h)2 and Section 10-106 of the Building Energy Efficiency Standards, this package of materials includes the County of Marin's proposed local ordinance requiring more stringent energy requirements than those set by California's 2016 Building Energy Efficiency Standards Title 24, Part 6. Please find the following materials enclosed:

- **Att. 1:** This cover letter
- **Att. 2:** Staff report to the County Board of Supervisors, outlining the goals of the updated green building standards
- **Att. 3:** Signed Ordinance No. 3685, which adopts updates the County's Building Ordinance, including requirements for energy reach standards beyond Title 24, Part 6 baseline for new single family and multifamily residential, and for new nonresidential construction. This provides clear requirements that buildings be designed to consume no more energy than permitted by Part 6.
- **Att. 4:** Checklists that outline local green building and energy efficiency standards, provided to increase clarity to applicants about project-specific requirements.
- **Att. 5:** Cost effectiveness studies, including an overview of their specific applications in the ordinance update, demonstrating the expected energy savings and the cost effectiveness of the ordinance in the County of Marin (climate zones 2 and 3).
- **Att. 6:** Evidence of CEQA compliance through the attached Notice of Exemption.
- **Att. 7:** A letter from the Chief Building Official to the Executive Director of the CEC about the changes to local green building and building energy efficiency standards.
