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DC Energy Services FPIP Docket Comments/Concerns Regarding Customer Eligibility

The following comments outline concerns regarding customer eligibility for the FPIP.

Customers not Meeting Tier 1 Criteria:

According to the current FPIP guidelines, in order to participate in Tier 1 of the program, a customer must participate in the Cap and Trade program; meaning they must emit a minimum of 25,000 metric tons of GHG emissions annually. Currently, there are 37 food processing facilities (based on NAICS code 311 & 312) who participate in the Cap and Trade program. However, the list below from the California Air Resource Board's (CARB) Mandatory Reporting of Greenhouse Gas Emissions Regulation (MRR) contains 42 customers who, at the time of the MRR's inception, exceeded annual GHG emissions of 10,000 metric tons, but remain below the 25,000 metric ton Tier 1 threshold. As the list demonstrates, there are many food processing facilities that will be deemed ineligible to participate in Tier 1. These are customers who could likely implement prescriptive type measures/projects that could result in significant direct and indirect GHG reductions. Disallowing these customers to participate in Tier 1 would be doing a great disservice to the program's success.

Also, there are approximately 50 food processing facilities, which come to mind, that are not listed in the MRR; this indicates they emit less than 10,000 metric tons of GHG per year. However, similar to the customers listed above, many of these customers are very large electrical energy consumers. These types of customers have significant potential for direct and indirect GHG reductions through prescriptive type measures/projects, but would not qualify for Tier 1 based on the current guidelines. Again, this would be doing a disservice to the program's success if these customers cannot participate in Tier 1.

Customers with Misleading NAICS Codes:

The MRR list does not label the customers below as 311 or 312 NAICS codes. Additionally, approximately 25% of the aforementioned 50 facilities emitting less than 10,000 metric tons of GHG per year are not labeled as 311 or 312 NAICS codes. With that said, we believe these customers should qualify to participate in the FPIP based on the definition of a Food Processor as outlined in the CEC's 3/28/18 presentation: "Manufacturers that transform livestock and agricultural products into products for intermediate or final consumption".
