Background

The Electric Program Investment Charge (EPIC) Program provides research funding for projects that lead to technological advancement and breakthroughs to overcome barriers that prevent achievement of California's statutory energy goals as defined by Senate Bill 350 (De León, Chapter 547, Statutes of 2015) and Senate Bill 32 (Pavley, Chapter 249, Statutes of 2016). AB 523 requires the Energy Commission to allocate at least 25 percent of EPIC technology demonstration and deployment funding for projects at sites that are located in and benefit disadvantaged communities. An additional 10 percent of the EPIC technology demonstration and deployment funding must be allocated to projects at sites that are located in and benefit low-income communities. AB 523 also requires the Energy Commission, under the EPIC program, to account for the adverse localized health impacts of proposed projects. This is accomplished with a description of the impact (on program administration) resulting from awarding funds to disadvantaged and low-income communities in the EPIC Annual Report.

1. Definitions of disadvantaged communities and low-income communities to be used by the California Energy Commission in compliance with AB 523.
2. Proposed scoring criteria for future TD&D solicitations.
3. Proposed localized health impact report draft template.
