Background

Senate Bill 1414 (Wolk, Chapter 768, Statutes of 2016) requires the Energy Commission, in consultation with the Contractors State License Board (CSLB), local governments, building officials, and stakeholders, to approve a plan by January 1, 2019, to promote compliance with the Energy Standards in the installation of central air conditioners and heat pump systems. SB 1414 authorizes the Commission to adopt regulations designed to increase compliance with permitting and inspection requirements, including sales and installations of central air conditioners and heat pump equipment in California, consistent

with the approved plan. Through a series of public workshops, the Commission will seek public input in a collaborative effort to develop this plan.

This workshop will include roundtable discussions on identifying major barriers and recommendations to overcome the barriers to compliance with the Energy Standards in the installation of central air conditioning and heat pump systems in residential and small commercial buildings.

Workshop participants will be asked to assist the Energy Commission to investigate and consider the impacts to key actors and stakeholders including, but not limited to, manufacturers, distributors, contractors, property owners, disadvantaged and low-income communities, Home Energy Rating System providers and raters, Energy Commission, California Public Utilities Commission, utilities, CSLB, building departments and other local governments, and the general public.

Public Comment

Staff will accept oral comments during the workshop. Comments may be limited to five minutes per speaker. Any comments may become part of the public record in this proceeding.
