BACKGROUND

The Energy Commission is responsible for reviewing, and ultimately approving or denying, all thermal electric power plants 50 MW and greater, proposed for construction and operation in California. Pursuant to Public Resources Code Section 25541, the Energy Commission may grant an exemption to this authority and allow applicants to obtain a license through the local review and approval process if a project is less than

100 MW. To grant this exemption, the Energy Commission must find that the proposed project would not create a substantial adverse impact on the environment or energy resources.

On December 21, 2017, Vantage Data Centers (Applicant), filed an application to the Energy Commission for the proposed Project. Subsequently amended on May 21, 2018, the Applicant seeks to build 47 diesel generators and three lifesaving emergency generators with a generation capacity of 91.7 megawatts (MW) in Santa Clara, California. The Project would not be interconnected to the electrical transmission grid and the generators would be exclusively used to provide backup generation to support the McLaren Data Center when electricity is unavailable. More details regarding the proposed Project and associated data center may be found in the Application. The Committee encourages the parties to consider this schedule an outer boundary and make their best efforts to complete the milestones ahead of these dates.

Purpose of the Prehearing Conference

The Prehearing Conference is a public forum where the Committee will assess the parties' readiness for an Evidentiary Hearing, consider any objections to conducting the Evidentiary Hearing using informal hearing procedures (see below), identify matters in dispute, and discuss the remaining schedule and procedures necessary to conclude the SPPE process.

Purpose of the Evidentiary Hearing

The Evidentiary Hearing is an administrative adjudicatory proceeding to receive evidence into the formal hearing record from the parties and receive public comment. Only the parties (Applicant, Intervenors, and Energy Commission Staff) may present evidence for introduction into the formal hearing record. Testimony offered by the parties shall be under oath. Each party has the right to present witnesses, introduce exhibits, and to rebut evidence of another party.⁴

Local, state, federal, and tribal governmental agencies may participate in the Evidentiary Hearing as necessary.⁵

Members of the public may present comments at the Evidentiary Hearing that become part of the hearing record. No advance notice need be provided.⁶

Informal Hearing Procedures

Pursuant to California Government Code section 11445.10 et seq., and the California Code of Regulations, title 20, section 1210,⁷ the Committee may conduct all or portions of the Evidentiary Hearing using formal or informal procedures.

Pursuant to Government Code section 11445.30, the Committee hereby notifies the parties that it has elected to utilize the informal hearing procedures.

The informal hearing process would generally proceed in the following order:

- 1. All parties' experts on the subject area at hand are sworn in as a panel.
- 2. Petitioner's experts provide a brief opening statement summarizing the key points and conclusions of their testimony.
- 3. Staff's experts provide a brief opening statement summarizing the key points and conclusions of their testimony.
- 4. Intervenor's experts provide a brief opening statement summarizing the key points and conclusions of their testimony.
- 5. Open discussion among the expert panelists led by the Committee.
- 6. Parties may follow up with questions of their own or other expert witnesses to the extent the Committee finds the questioning productive.
- 7. At the conclusion of the parties' examination of the experts, the Committee may ask witnesses additional questions or allow panelists to ask additional questions of each other and to offer follow-up responses.

Any party objecting to the use of informal hearing procedures shall include that objection in its Prehearing Conference Statement, as discussed below.

NOTICE OF CLOSED SESSION DELIBERATIONS

At any time during the Prehearing Conference or Evidentiary Hearing, the Committee may adjourn to a closed session in accordance with California Government Code section 11126, subdivision (c)(3), which allows a state body, including a delegated committee, to hold a closed session to deliberate on a decision to be reached in a proceeding the state body was required by law to conduct.

ORDERS REGARDING TESTIMONY, EXHIBIT LISTS, AND PREHEARING CONFERENCE STATEMENTS

All parties intending to submit evidence for consideration at the Evidentiary Hearing are **ORDERED** to docket evidence, written testimony, exhibit lists, and prehearing conference statements no later than 5:00 p.m. on the dates specified in the above schedule, unless otherwise directed by the Committee. Failure by a party to comply with the filing requirements stated in this Order may preclude that party from participating in the Evidentiary Hearing.

The Prehearing Conference Statement must specify under separate headings:

- 1. The subject areas that are complete and ready to proceed to Evidentiary Hearing.
- 2. The subject areas upon which any party proposes to introduce testimony in writing rather than through oral testimony.

- 3. The subject areas that are not complete and not yet ready to proceed to Evidentiary Hearing, and the reasons therefor.
- 4. The subject areas that remain disputed and require adjudication, the issues in dispute, and the precise nature of the dispute for each issue.
- 5. The identity of each witness the party intends to sponsor at the Evidentiary Hearing, the subject area(s) about which the witness(es) will offer testimony, whether the testimony will be oral or in writing, a brief summary of the testimony to be offered by the witness(es), qualifications of each witness, the time required to present testimony by each witness, and whether the witness seeks to testify telephonically.
- 6. Subject areas upon which the party desires to question the other parties' witness(es), a summary of the scope of the questions (including questions regarding witness qualifications), the issue(s) to which the questions pertain, and the time desired to question each witness. (Note: a party who fails to provide, with specificity, the scope, relevance, and time for questioning other parties' witness(es) risks preclusion from questioning witnesses on that subject area).
- 7. A list identifying exhibits with transaction numbers (TN) that the party intends to offer into evidence during the Evidentiary Hearing and the technical subject areas to which they apply (see below for further details on Exhibit Lists).
- 8. Proposals for briefing deadlines or other scheduling matters.
- 9. Any objection by the party to the use of the informal hearing procedure outlined above.⁸

All documentary evidence must be filed in this proceeding's docket (17-SPPE-01) and have a transaction number assigned by the Energy Commission Dockets Unit in accordance with the General Orders Regarding Electronic Document Formats, Electronic Filing, Service of Documents and Other Matters filed February 22, 2018.⁹ Exhibits without a TN, or not filed in this proceeding's docket, will not be received into evidence absent a showing of good cause.

The parties shall exchange documentary evidence, including written testimony, by filing an **Exhibit List**. Each document shall be numbered and identified on the Exhibit List as follows:

- Applicant's exhibits shall be numbered *consecutively* as **Exhibits 1 through 199**;
- Energy Commission Staff's exhibits shall be numbered *consecutively* as **Exhibits** 200 through 299.
- Intervenor Robert Simpson/Helping Hand Tools' exhibits shall be numbered *consecutively* as **Exhibits 300 through 399.**

The Exhibit Lists shall be formatted as four columns. The first column shall list the proposed Exhibit Number. The second column shall identify the TN of the corresponding document. The third column shall state the title of the document as shown in the docket. The fourth column shall state the subject area(s) to which the exhibit applies. Hearing Office Staff from the Energy Commission will then add the Exhibit Number information into the e-filing system and issue a Master Exhibit List.

TRANSCRIPTS
