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NOTICE OF RECEIPT FACILITY CLOSURE PLAN FOR OAKLEY GENERATING STATION (09-AFC-04C)

On July 18, 2018, the Contra Costa Generating Station, LLC, the owner of Oakley Generating Station (OGS) filed a petition with the California Energy Commission (Energy Commission) requesting permanent closure of the facility (TN 224258).

OGS is a 624-megawatt combined cycle facility located in the city of Oakley in Contra Costa County, California. The project was certified by the Energy Commission on May 18, 2011, and was authorized to commence construction on July 26, 2011. The facility was designed to tie into the regional electrical grid at Pacific Gas and Electric Company's (PG&E's) Contra Costa Substation in Antioch.

Construction of OGS commenced on June 10, 2011. Initial construction completed at the project site include installation of a small concrete foundation for the emergency diesel generator, clearing and grading of the power block area, creation of bio-swales around the power block perimeter, installation of a construction power pole, and creation of a storm water detention basin. The construction fill materials removed from the power bock area was transferred to temporary storage piles (stockpiles) within the Chemours (formerly DuPont, the holder of the fee simple interest) property. By agreement with Chemours, the remaining soil stockpile would have been transferred to Chemours for use in the remediation work at the former DuPont industrial property as well as other redevelopment activities. The project construction was suspended in September 2011, after which no additional site- or project-related features were constructed.

The review process includes an evaluation of the consistency of the proposed Closure Plan with the Energy Commission's Decision and a determination on whether the closure of the facility would remain in compliance with applicable laws, ordinances, regulations and standards (Cal.

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Code of Regs., tit. 20, § 1769). After staff has completed its independent review and analysis of the Closure Plan, it will publish its assessment for public review and comment. Upon completion of its review and analysis, staff will provide its written recommendation for consideration by the Energy Commission at a regularly scheduled Business Meeting.

This Notice of Receipt has been mailed to the Commission's facility mail list of interested parties and property owners adjacent to the facility site. It has also been emailed to the facility listserv. The listserv is an automated Energy Commission e-mail system by which information about this facility is e-mailed to parties who have subscribed.
