Background

Senate Bill 1 (Murray, Chapter 132, Statutes of 2006) requires the Energy Commission to establish eligibility criteria, conditions for incentives, and rating standards for projects applying for ratepayer-funded incentives for solar energy systems. The *Guidelines for California's Solar Electric Incentive Programs (Senate Bill 1)* provide a framework for the California Public Utilities Commission's (CPUC) California Solar Initiative Program, the Energy Commission's New Solar Homes Partnership (NSHP), and publicly owned utilities' (POU) solar energy system incentive programs. The initial *Guidelines for*

California's Solar Electric Incentive Programs Pursuant to Senate Bill 1 were adopted in December 2007, and have been updated periodically to address program modifications and market developments. The Guidelines for California's Solar Electric Incentive Programs (Senate Bill 1) are being updated to reflect the release of new equipment standards, current and planned requirements for smart inverters, and solar paired with storage installations.
