## **Background**

The Energy Commission adopted the 2019 update to the Standards on May 9, 2018. The Residential and Nonresidential ACM Reference Manuals and the public domain compliance software are key components anticipated to be approved by the Energy Commission at least six months before the January 1, 2020, implementation date of the Standards.

- Mandatory features
  - Fan efficacy, water heating, and indoor air quality (IAQ)
- Performance approach
  - o Energy design rating (EDR) compliance score metric
  - Photovoltaic (PV) requirements
  - Demand Response (DR) credits
    - Battery storage, thermal storage, and pre-cooling
  - Self-utilization credit
  - Quality Insulation Installation (QII)
  - Water heating systems
    - Compact hot water distribution and drain water heat recovery
  - Whole house fan and central fan integrated ventilation system
