Purpose

The workshop provides an opportunity for public comment on the draft guidelines for the Low Carbon Fuel Production Program (LCFPP). The draft guidelines describe the proposed program structure, eligibility categories for selecting projects for funding, solicitation procedures, project implementation requirements, project reporting, and statutory requirements. Information and recommendations gathered as a result of the workshop will be considered prior to issuing final guidelines.

Background

The LCFPP, funded by the Budget Act of 2018, as amended by Senate Bill (SB) 856 (Budget and Fiscal Review Committee, Chapter 30, Statutes of 2018), provides grants to California's vehicle fuel production industry to reduce greenhouse gas emissions associated with transportation use, and furthers the purposes of Assembly Bill (AB) 32 (Nuñez, Chapter 488, Statutes of 2006) and SB 32 (Pavley, Chapter 249, Statutes of 2016). This program is part of California Climate Investments, a statewide program that puts billions of Cap-and-Trade dollars to work reducing greenhouse gas emissions, strengthening the economy, and improving public health and the environment — particularly in disadvantaged communities. The LCFPP will support new and expanded renewable ultra-low carbon transportation fuel production at commercial-scale advanced fuel production facilities, and help the California fuel industry, vehicle manufacturers, and operators work towards a low-carbon future.

Public Comment

Oral comments: Staff will accept oral comments during the workshop. Comments may be limited to **three** minutes per speaker and one speaker per organization. Any comments may become part of the public record for this proceeding.

Written comments: Written comments must be submitted to the Docket Unit by **5:00 p.m. on March 12, 2019**. Written comments will also be accepted at the workshop; however, the Energy Commission may not have time to review them before the conclusion of the meeting.

Written and oral comments, attachments, and associated contact information (e.g. address, phone number, email address) become part of the viewable public record. This information may also become available via any Internet search engine.
