Dear Commissioners:

Thank you for accepting public comments on the recent joint agency workshop on building decarbonization. Reducing greenhouse gas emissions in our buildings is an essential part of achieving our critical statewide climate goals. We agree with the growing consensus that building electrification is the most viable and predictable path to zero-emissions buildings, and write to ask the Commission to support it.

Remaining tied to the gas system by using biomethane or synthetic gas is not a feasible solution for decarbonizing buildings, and we don't want to see the Commission waste public money supporting this distraction from real solutions. For one thing, biomethane and synthetic gas are very limited in supply, and very expensive. Additionally, biomethane and synthetic gas leak from pipelines, release criteria air pollutants, and pose safety risks -- just like fossil gas.

Instead, we want to use the clean electricity powering California's electric grid to fully power our homes. The gas industry argues that biomethane is needed to preserve customer choice -- but right now, with no incentives to support people like us who are interested in switching from gas to clean electric options, Californians have no real choice to go all-electric.

We want to see truly clean, zero emissions solutions to decarbonize buildings in California. The time to begin this transition is now, and statewide leadership is needed. Please support building electrification and devote limited state incentives to clean electric solutions, not furthering our dependence on gas.
