COMMITTEE ORDER GRANTING PETITION TO INTERVENE

Upon consideration of the Petition to Intervene (Petition) filed by California Unions for Reliable Energy (CURE or Petitioner)¹ in the Application for a Small Power Plant Exemption (SPPE) for the Laurelwood Data Center Project (Project), the committee designated to conduct proceedings (Committee)² in this matter makes the following findings:

1. On May 21, 2019, a Petition in the above-captioned proceeding was filed by:

- 2. On May 30, 2019, CURE filed a supplement to the Petition (Supplement) specifying the topics on which it and its members would like to intervene.³
- 3. The Petition and Supplement contain the information required by the Energy Commission's regulations.⁴

- 4. No opposition to the Petition has been filed, and the deadline for such opposition was June 4, 2019.
- 5. CURE's interests are relevant to the above-captioned proceeding.
- 6. CURE has demonstrated a bona fide interest in the Project and has demonstrated possession of information or expertise that may help the Committee in preparing a proposed decision.
- 7. Intervention is granted at the Committee's discretion to the degree that it finds intervention reasonable and relevant. The Presiding Member or Committee may impose conditions on all intervenors' participation in the hearings in order to promote the orderly conduct of the proceeding.

THEREFORE, the Committee **ORDERS** that the Petition to Intervene in this matter be **GRANTED** and that CURE be placed upon the Proof of Service List as an Intervenor. Petitioner may exercise the rights and shall fulfill the obligations of a party as set forth in all orders issued in this matter and California Code of Regulations, title 20, section 1212. Deadlines and other matters shall not be extended or changed by the granting of this Petition.⁵

The Committee further **ORDERS** that the Petitioner's participation is limited to the direct, indirect, and cumulative impacts of the following topic areas as requested by Petitioner: **AIR QUALITY, PUBLIC HEALTH, GREENHOUSE GAS EMISSIONS, HAZARDOUS MATERIALS, ENERGY & ENERGY RESOURCES, WATER RESOURCES, and NOISE**. Petitioner's intervention is subject to further modification at the discretion of the Presiding Member or the Committee. These limitations of Petitioner's participation as an intervenor do not affect Petitioner's ability to make public comments on other topics in the proceeding.

The Energy Commission welcomes and values intervenor participation in its energy facility siting process. A link to the Energy Commission's regulations describing intervenor participation is posted on the right-hand side menu of the Public Adviser's webpage at: https://www.energy.ca.gov/public_adviser/index.html.

As an intervenor, Petitioner is required to file and serve documents on other parties and to follow the Energy Commission's procedures and orders regarding presenting witnesses and evidence.

Petitioner is further required to review the "General Orders Regarding Motions, Electronic Filing, Service of Documents, and Other Matters," the rules regarding filings, 7 the rules of evidence that apply at the Evidentiary Hearings, 8 and the rules prohibiting off-the-

record contacts with commissioners, their advisors, or the hearing officer about the Project.⁹

Petitioner's failure to fulfill these responsibilities may result in the Committee limiting or precluding Petitioner's participation in the proceedings.
