## Reasons for the request;

All Energy Commission regulations are prompted by the identification of a "problem" that needs to be addressed by the Energy Commission through the adoption, amendment, or repeal of regulations in order to enforce or administer a statute. For example, when the Energy Commission enacts a new program or amends regulation governing existing programs, the Energy Commission may leave it up to the staff administering the program to implement the program. The Energy Commission must then adopt, amend, or repeal regulations to avoid the use of prohibited "underground regulations."

The Energy Commission places requirements on the filing of all documents for the record in a proceeding. These requirements are found in 20 CCR Section 1208 and 1208.1.

1208 (c) Places the responsibility to ensure that a document has been timely filed with the person, party, or entity that desires the document to be filed. A docket is required before any document can be filed. I don't find any regulations that provides the person, party, or entity that desires documents to be filed in a timely manner a method to open a docket in a timely manner.

The lack of a method to open a docket in a timely manner, so to file for the record for a proceeding, frustrates the public's ability to petition their government when a filing is required.
