Background

In July 2012, federal appliance efficiency regulations for general service fluorescent lamps (GSFLs) became effective. However, the U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) excluded certain types of linear fluorescent lamps from its definition of GSFLs, exempting them from the GSFL efficiency regulations. Exempt linear fluorescent lamps include those explicitly excluded from the definition of GSFL: (1) fluorescent lamps designed to promote plant growth; (2) fluorescent lamps specifically designed for cold temperature applications; (3) colored fluorescent lamps; (4) impact-resistant fluorescent lamps; (5) reflectorized or aperture lamps; (6) fluorescent lamps designed for use in reprographic equipment; (7) lamps primarily designed to produce radiation in the ultraviolet region of the spectrum; and (8) lamps with a Color Rendering Index of 87 or greater. (See 42 U.S.C. § 6291(30)(B). Exempt linear fluorescent lamps, "due to shape or length restrictions, such as two-foot or circline fluorescent lamps. (See 42 U.S.C. § 6291(30)(A).)

On January 19, 2018, the Energy Commission issued an Order Instituting Rulemaking (OIR) to formally begin the process of considering standards, test procedures, labeling requirements, and other efficiency measures for various appliances, including federally exempted linear fluorescent lamps. Any measures resulting from that OIR will be incorporated into California's Appliance Efficiency Standards in Title 20 of the California Code of Regulations, Sections 1601 through 1609. On April 4, 2018, the Energy Commission released an invitation to comment to seek information from interested parties and to provide an opportunity for interested parties to submit proposals for standards, test procedures, marking and labeling requirements, and other measures to improve the efficiency of federally exempted linear fluorescent lamps.
