Progress / Recommendations



SB 1072 (LEYVA, 2018)

SB 1072 aims to build the capacity of local communities to access public funding for climate change mitigation + adaptation projects

REGIONAL CLIMATE COLLABORATIVES

- Made up of local experts and stakeholders
- Builds community-driven leadership, knowledge and skills
- Activities include: outreach and education, partnership development, grant application development...
- Strategic Growth Council must develop guidelines by October 2019

TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE

- SGC will develop technical assistance guidelines that state agencies may use in technical assistance delivery
- SGC must develop guidelines by July 2020

ONE-STOP-SHOP

FOR CARB'S EQUITY ZEV REPLACEMENT INCENTIVE PROJECTS

One-Stop-Shop aims to streamline and improve access to zero-emission vehicle incentives available to income-qualified consumers

STREAMLINE APPLICATIONS

- Develops a single multilingual application tool for low-income consumers to access clean vehicle incentives
- Application tool pre-qualifies consumers based on income eligibility and other specific project requirements

COMMUNITY OUTREACH

- Community outreach to increase program participation by low-income consumers
- Outreach partners include: SEIU California, GRID Alternatives, Liberty Hill, Blue Lake Rancheria and the Native American Environmental Protection Coalition

RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1** **Coordination, integration + alignment:** investments (locally and at the state level) must be aligned to achieve transformative benefits
- 2** **Build community capacity:** agencies must fund and build the capacity of local communities implementing climate policies
- 3** **Secure permanent and long-term funding:** agencies must co-fund and ensure the sustainability of critical community access programs
- 4** **Bundle incentive programs:** integrate clean energy and energy efficiency consumer incentives into One-Stop-Shop
- 5** **Mandatory technical assistance:** agencies that administer targeted funding for priority populations must offer technical assistance
