The Electric Transportation Community Development Corporation (ETCDC) appreciates the opportunity to provide its support for the California Energy Commission's 2019-2020 Investment Plan Update for the Clean Transportation Program.

ETCDC is committed to a zero-emission transportation future to ensure clean air, combat climate change and spur economic growth. We support efforts to ensure that communities most vulnerable to the adverse impacts of air and climate change pollution and/or economically disadvantaged will benefit from a transition to zero-emission transportation.

California has ambitious zero-emission vehicle (ZEV) and charging infrastructure goals.^{1,2} According to the CEC's own assessment of need and an independent assessment done by the California Electric Transportation Coalition (CalETC), the number of charging ports currently publicly available is well below what is needed to support the number of ZEVs currently in California. The gap between accessible infrastructure and the need is growing by the month in California and threatens our progress toward meeting our shared ambitious goals for ZEV market acceleration.

ETCDC supports the emphasis on zero-emission vehicles and infrastructure and supports the proposed allocations in the revised Investment Plan. The revised Investment Plan allocates \$32.7 million for light-duty EV charging infrastructure, \$30 million for medium- and heavy-duty ZEVs and infrastructure, \$20 million for hydrogen refueling infrastructure, \$10 million for zero- and near-zero-carbon fuel production, and \$2.5 million for workforce development.³ We look forward to

working with the Commission and staff as the funding for these categories is further divided into programs and as solicitations are developed.

The CEC requested input on equity considerations in the Advisory Committee makeup and priorities. ETCDC supports an equity framework and equity metrics to be included in the Commission's future planning and fund allocation efforts. We also support including additional equity representation on the Clean Transportation Program Advisory Committee. ETCDC looks forward to working with the Commission and staff to support community-based organizations and other equity community representatives in the Investment Plan process and to help ensure the investments are benefiting vulnerable communities.
