Hola Rosemary,

As I shared with you we work with all energy segments, including the rate payers and consumers. There is a deep concern that the cost of electricity has risen from 2 cents per KWH to 27 cents per KWH for the average California household after these clean energy policies were generated from Sacramento.

The public believes the culprit for the higher costs are the "Greedy Utilities" when in fact its the policy makers driving up the costs of energy in California and require utilities to implement them without any choices to the contrary.

While the poor air quality in California is the target of these policies, the general public has not yet fully connected the two. In their minds, no one has asked them if they would like to pay more for the better air quality. This would be a very interesting question to pose.
