PALMDALE ENERGY PROJECT REQUEST TO TERMINATE

On December 2, 2019, Palmdale Energy, LLC filed a request with the California Energy Commission (CEC) to terminate the Commission certification for the Palmdale Energy Project (08-AFC-09C).

BACKGROUND

The Palmdale Hybrid Power Project was licensed on August 10, 2011, as a nominal 570-megawatt (MW) hybrid facility utilizing combined-cycle and solar trough technologies.

On August 30, 2015, the project owner, Palmdale Energy, LLC filed a petition to change the Palmdale Hybrid Power Project from a 570-MW hybrid combined-cycle and solar trough power plant to a natural gas-fired 645-MW combined-cycle power plant. Specifically, the petition reduced the project site to 50 acres, eliminated the solar component, replaced the combustion turbine technology with fast-start flexible technology, and changed the project name from Palmdale Hybrid Power Project to Palmdale Energy Project. The project site is in the City of Palmdale, however, the facility was never constructed and there was no ground disturbance.

STAFF ANALYSIS AND CONCLUSIONS

CEC technical staff reviewed the request to terminate and determined that no environmental impacts, no ground disturbance, no violation of applicable laws, ordinances, regulations and standards (LORS), or effect on an environmental justice (EJ) population would occur.

Staff also concludes that terminating the Commission certification for the Palmdale Energy Project will not violate any of the conditions adopted in the Final Commission Decision

TERMINATION APPROVAL PROCESS

Staff intends to recommend approval of the Palmdale Energy Project termination request at the February 20, 2020, CEC Business Meeting. At this Business Meeting, any person may present oral or written statements relevant to the request.
