About the Public Advisor

- Statutorily-mandated role (Warren Alquist Act, Public Resources Code §25217.1)
- Licensed attorney nominated by CEC and appointed by Governor for 3 years
- Duties (PRC §25222) & Additional Services:
 - \odot Help public understand CEC processes
 - Assist public to participate in proceedings
 - \odot Recommend to CEC approaches to engage public
 - \odot Ensure timely notices to public
 - \odot Identify missing stakeholders and help conduct outreach to them
 - Assist with access to language services & reasonable accommodations



PAO is a Bridge between CEC and Public

Parties Involved in SPPE Proceedings

- Committee CEC appoints a committee of 2 or more members to preside over the proceeding and carry on investigations, inquiries, or hearings. (Pub Res Code §25211)
- Members Committee composed of a commissioner designated as the "presiding member" to chair the proceeding and another commissioner assists as an "associate member". (CCR, §§1201, 1203, 1204)
- Hearing Officer Committee may designate a hearing officer to help conduct proceeding. (CCR, §1205)

- Applicant Any person who submits an application for certification. (Pub Res Code, §25101)
- Intervenor Person or group that intervenes as a party to a proceeding. (CCR, §1211.7)
- Interested Parties Any person who CEC finds and acknowledges as having a real and direct interest in a proceeding. (Pub Res Code, §25114)



Public Outreach for Walsh & Sequoia SPPEs

- Posted status conference ad in English and Spanish in San Jose Mercury News
- Informed public thru CEC listservs; follow up emails; and calls to interested parties within 12 mile radius of data centers
- CEC's Cultural Resources Division shared the Notice of Receipt to California Native American tribes associated with the project area
- CEC STEP Division staff notified residents within 1,000 ft. of project site
- PAO sent these Notices to Interested Parties in our data center spreadsheet, including:
 - Local & state elected representatives; air district officials; parks and recreation departments
 - Chambers of commerce; community based organizations; environmental and social justice advocates; environmental health groups; asthma clinics
 - Local schools; places of worship; daycare centers; and soccer clubs



How to Participate in SPPE Proceedings - Informal

- Sign up for project listservs to receive email notifications
 - Walsh Data Center https://ww2.energy.ca.gov/sitingcases/walsh/
 - Sequoia Data Center https://ww2.energy.ca.gov/sitingcases/sequoia/
- Attend events in person or remotely
- Share comments during public comment period; relate thru Public Advisor; or submit written comments to docket
 - Comments seriously considered by the Committee and Staff; valuable to establish a robust record
- Key opportunities for comments: studies and evidentiary hearing(s)



How to Participate in SPPE Proceedings - Formal

Become an Intervenor

- \odot Intervenor is person or group that is a party to the proceedings
- \odot Has similar responsibilities and obligations as other parties in proceeding
- \odot An Intervenor, similar to the applicant and staff, may:
 - Present evidence and witnesses
 - Object to other parties' evidence
 - Cross-examine other witnesses, and
 - File motions

• File Petition to Intervene

Anyone may file petition; not necessary to be or be represented by attorney (CCR, §§1206 &1211.7)
Petition is drafted by party; no specific form to file but must include required info (CCR, §1200.7(a))
File early to meet filing and discovery deadlines set by Presiding Member (CCR, §1211.7)
File with CEC's Siting, Transmission, Environmental Protection Division; include Docket number (CCR)
