Comments on the Staff Concept

Who is the customer for the building? Create a profile for users and document into an end-users profile.

What are the populations' problems we want to help solve? This is critical information; it will give us the challenges our target populations need solutions to on a continuum.

How does what we do solve the user's problem? Can our building/design idea benefit end-users and improve their current state of living and environment; have we carved out their input?

We should also consider non profits that build affordable housing and their asset to this project. They provide touch-to-touch to impoverished communities and many add value to developing and sustaining community equity. In many cases, they establish a presence that overlays affordable housing with community programs and initiatives which drives community impact.

Story mapping is a great way to find imperative information one needs to begin any process, whether it is a design process, a program, or a new idea that will allow touch points across general population areas. This process will coincide with the design development and add a narrative to the purpose of the project.

Last but not least, include a collaborative session with stakeholders, community members, builders, designers, and other management to ask key questions to work out innovative ideas and move them to deliver a fantastic service or product to end-users.
