The proposed changes are indicated by a single underline and single strikeout in the *Guidelines* document.

## **Background**

The proposed changes extend two program deadlines in response to the COVID-19 public health crisis: the final project completion date by one year to June 30, 2021, and Final Project Completion Reports date by one year to June 30, 2022.

Passed by voters in November 2012, Proposition 39 makes changes to corporate income taxes and provides up to \$550 million to improve the energy efficiency of California's aging schools and grow the state's significant clean energy economy. California public schools (K-12), county offices of education, community college districts, charter schools, and state special schools may receive funding for fiscal years starting with the 2013-14 fiscal year.

Under Senate Bill 73 (Committee on Budget and Fiscal Review, Chapter 29, Statutes 2013), the Legislature directed the CEC to adopt the *Guidelines* at a publicly noticed meeting and to provide an opportunity for public comment. The adoption of the *Guidelines* is exempt from the administrative rulemaking process found in Chapter 3.5 (commencing with Section 11340) of Part 1 of Division 3 of Title 2 of the Government Code. The initial *Proposition 39: California Clean Energy Jobs Act – 2013 Program Implementation Guidelines* were formally adopted by the CEC in December 2013. Nonsubstantive revisions were made in April 2014 and November 2017, and substantive changes were made in June 2014, December 2014, and July 2016.
