### **Research Program Background**

The Electric Program Investment Charge (EPIC) is funded by an electricity ratepayer surcharge established by the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) in 2011.

#### The purpose of EPIC Program is to:

- Benefit the ratepayers of the three largest electric investor-owned utilities\*.
- Fund clean energy research, demonstration and deployment projects that support California's energy policy goals and promote greater electricity reliability, lower costs, and increased safety.
- Encourage technological advancement and breakthroughs to achieve State's statutory energy goals.

## **Project Background**

- Project started in June 2018 with Navigant Consulting as the prime contractor.
- The main project objective was to help to ensure that EPIC funds are strategically focused to make advancement on the most significant technological challenges and to identify, describe, and prioritize key research and development needs in achieving California's goals for integrating high penetrations of distributed energy resources (DER).



### Past Workshops

- 3/25/19: Provided information on the publicly released DER Draft Technical Assessment and solicited feedback from stakeholders on the status of DER technologies and strategies as well as barriers currently limiting DERs.
- 7/25/19: Introduced a prioritization methodology to rank potential DER research needs and solicited input from stakeholders both to better characterize the status of DER technologies and strategies and to identify barriers to efficient integration.
- 9/17/19: Summarized the research ideas submitted by stakeholders, discussed the screening process, and presented the preliminary scores and ranks of the research ideas.
