Subject: Public comment re 2022 building standards

I am a Council member in the City of Glendale, a city of over 200,000 people and the 4th largest city in LA County.

I urge the Commission to adopt a uniform all-electric standard for the 2022 code.

We recognize the urgency of the climate crisis and the importance of building decarbonization to help achieve state and local GHG reduction goals. We are also concerned with indoor air quality, especially as people are increasingly forced indoors because of fire pollutants and heat-induced smog.

We are currently considering reach codes for building electrification but would much prefer to avoid the cost and complexity of the reach code process. We'd also like to avoid the problems that come with inconsistent codes among neighboring cities competing for the same developer dollars.
