Opposition to All-Electric Code in 2022 Energy Code

I am a small business selling hearth products such as gas and woodburning fireplaces and woodstoves.

My customers, especially those building new homes, depend on natural gas and propane as available sources for heating when the power goes out, which it often does in our area, both intentionally and accidentally. A lot of my customers use heating gas fireplaces to have a convenient source of secondary heating in their home which is also aesthetically pleasing, and which still works even when the power is out.

I know that some people are saying the state must move right away to only using electricity in new homes in the next energy code. Until the electric system is 100% reliable and more cost effective in our area, or we have long lasting on-site battery storage systems, homeowners in my area will need to be able to use gas, especially propane, to keep warm, not to mention take showers and cook, when the power goes out. The public still has no idea that there really isn't an "eco" friendly way to dispose of the older solar panels that are damaged or old. We need to create a sufficient water storage for water necessity and hydro electric power production since you (the governor) is trying to take delta water and send it down south (big So. Cal. money in back of that) away from all this new construction from Sacramento north, where will the water come from for that overbuilding ? These issues are hard, but please think this thru from all sides, not just because it is popular that day for that organization.
