Dear Ms. MacDonald:

Pursuant to the requirements of Assembly Bill (AB) 2514 (Skinner, Chapter 469, Statutes of 2010), Anaheim Public Utilities (APU) hereby submits this report to the California Energy Commission (CEC) regarding its compliance with the energy storage (ES) system procurement targets and policies adopted by the Anaheim City Council.

On August 25, 2020, consistent with APU's re-evaluation, the Anaheim City Council approved Resolution 2020-099 and set a new ES procurement target of (a) 0 MW of energy storage by December 31, 2021; and (b) up to 50 MW of battery-based energy storage by December 31, 2026, subject to City Council authorization. Consistent with this latest ES procurement targets determination, APU is actively moving forward with project planning and evaluating procurement options to meet the 2026 target.

APU continues to evaluate advances in ES systems and closely monitors other utilities' investments in ES systems. APU has observed the increasing need for dispatchable resources in California given the reliability events that occurred this past summer and is planning to utilize battery-based ES systems to help meet peak demands. Additionally, APU now offers an energy storage rebate to assist customers with shifting their demands along with time-based rate options.
