BACKGROUND

The Committee Proposed Decision

C1-Santa Clara, LLC (Applicant)⁴ proposes to construct and operate the Sequoia Backup Generating Facility, consisting of 54 diesel-fired backup generators to provide an uninterruptible power supply to the Sequoia Data Center during interruptions of the electrical supply (Project).⁵

On August 21, 2020, the Committee issued a Committee Proposed Decision (Proposed Decision) that recommended approval of a mitigated negative declaration and granting an SPPE for the Project.⁶ The Proposed Decision relied on an initial study/proposed mitigated negative declaration (IS/PMND) to find that the Project would not have significant environmental impacts, including air quality impacts.

Motion to Remand

The CEC held a public hearing to consider the Proposed Decision at the September 9, 2020 business meeting. During the public hearing on the Proposed Decision, three parties to the proceeding, CEC staff (Staff), Applicant, and intervenor Robert Sarvey, an intervenor in the case, presented arguments and comments to the CEC. In addition, representatives from the California Air Resources Board (CARB) and Bay Area Air Quality Management District (BAAQMD) made oral comments on the Proposed Decision. CARB, in particular, proposed that the CEC consider additional information about air quality and public health impacts of the Project, particularly in light of the energy emergencies caused by heat storms and public safety power shutoffs in August and September 2020. After conducting the public hearing on the Proposed Decision and deliberating in a properly-noticed closed session, the CEC Commissioners returned to the public portion

of the hearing.¹² They approved a motion to remand the proceedings back to the Committee to consider air quality and public health impacts in light of the recent energy emergencies (Motion to Remand).¹³

Affirming Motion to Remand with Modifications

On September 18, 2020, the CEC noticed, on its own motion, a hearing on the Motion to Remand to determine whether it should be affirmed, affirmed with modifications, or vacated.¹⁴ The notice of the hearing was revised several times,¹⁵ but, ultimately, a hearing on the Motion to Remand was scheduled for the November 16, 2020 business meeting.¹⁶

On October 15, 2020, CARB filed written comments, expanding on its oral comments made during the public hearing on September 9, 2020.¹⁷ In the written comments, CARB challenged the sufficiency of the environmental analysis in the Proposed Decision (and the IS/PMND) of the Project's potential to cause significant air quality impacts. CARB stated that the inputs used to model the Project's one-hour NO₂ impacts were incorrect. CARB also challenged the Proposed Decision's conclusion that the modeling of emergency operations was speculative and indicated that the CEC should conduct scenario modeling where one or more engines is operated under different circumstances.¹⁸ Staff,¹⁹ Robert Sarvey,²⁰ and Applicant²¹ all filed comments responding to CARB's written comments.²²

At the public hearing on November 16, 2020, the CEC received oral comments from Robert Sarvey, Applicant, Staff, representatives from CARB and BAAQMD, respectively, Claire Warshaw, Earthjustice/Sierra Club, and the Santa Clara and San Benito Counties Building and Construction Trades Council. At the conclusion of the

hearing, the CEC voted to affirm the Motion to Remand with modifications and ordered the following:

The Committee is directed to conduct limited additional proceedings to consider those comments raised by the California Air Resources Board and the Bay Area Air Quality Management District in this proceeding that address 1) input assumptions regarding NO₂ impacts from routine testing and maintenance; and 2) direct and cumulative impacts of emergency operations of the Project's backup generators. The Committee may address additional issues that arise during those proceedings.

In order to facilitate a timely resolution of this matter, the Committee is directed to report on progress in this proceeding to the full California Energy Commission at the January 2021 business meeting.²³

PURPOSE OF THE COMMITTEE CONFERENCE

The purpose of the Committee Conference is to discuss the progress that the parties have made to address the comments raised by CARB and the BAAQMD in this proceeding regarding 1) input assumptions regarding NO₂ impacts from routine testing and maintenance; and 2) direct and cumulative impacts of emergency operations of the Project's backup generators.

The Committee and the parties may also discuss a schedule for the proceeding and address any other outstanding issues.

We direct the parties' attention to the section "ORDERS REGARDING RESPONSES TO COMMITTEE QUESTIONS AND REQUEST FOR INFORMATION," regarding their expected participation in and responsibilities for the Committee Conference.

In addition to the formal parties, the Committee invites interested public agencies, particularly CARB and the BAAQMD, to work with the parties and respond to the Committee questions and request for information and attend the Committee Conference.

NOTICE OF CLOSED SESSION DELIBERATIONS

During the Committee Conference noticed herein, the Committee may adjourn to a closed session in accordance with California Government Code section 11126, subdivision (c)(3), which allows a state body, including a delegated committee, to hold a

closed session to deliberate on a decision to be reached in a proceeding the state body is required by law to conduct.

ORDERS REGARDING RESPONSES TO COMMITTEE QUESTIONS AND REQUEST FOR INFORMATION

Based on the written comments filed by CARB and the parties' filed responses, the Committee wishes to resolve the issues raised by CARB and BAAQMD during the CEC's initial consideration of the Proposed Decision and adoption of the Motion to Remand. To that end, the Committee directs the parties and requests that CARB and BAAQMD respond to the following questions and request for information no later than **5:00 p.m. on December 14, 2020**.

- 1. The parties are directed to meet and confer, and invite participation by CARB and BAAQMD, to determine whether any of the outstanding issues identified in the Order can be resolved among the parties and what issues remain in dispute. The parties are encouraged to prepare a joint statement setting out their positions as to the identified issues, as well as responses to the questions set forth below. If the parties are unable to prepare a joint statement, then they are to submit individual statements.
 - a. Is the Applicant's modeling, relied upon by Staff in the IS/PMND, adequate for the analysis of NO₂ impacts from routine testing and maintenance operations? If not, describe why the analysis is not adequate and what would cure the described inadequacies?
 - b. Can scenario modeling be used to bound a range of potential impacts from emergency operations? Are there other options to assess impacts of emergency operations? If so, how long will it take to perform those options?
- 2. The Committee asks CARB or BAAQMD, respectively or jointly, to provide any additional information/data they deem relevant to resolving the outstanding issues identified by the CEC in the Order. Further, the Committee requests that CARB and BAAQMD explain the relevance of any such information/data and how the Committee should utilize such information/data.

Local, state, federal, and tribal governmental agencies and members of the public are welcome to attend and offer oral or written comments at the Committee Conference.
