## **comment on SB 100 report**

Dear Sir/Madam,

Thank you to the staff of the CEC, CPUC, and CARB for all their hard work on the implementation of SB 100, a law our organization advocated for.

On behalf of our more than 2,500 supporters, I would like to echo the comments of others made at the December 4th workshop on the draft report: we also think offshore wind should be part of the clean energy mix. Given the record-shattering heat waves and devastating wildfires that are occurring every year, we also believe the timeline for SB 100 needs to be moved up, preferably to 2030.

In addition, we strongly feel that all California state agencies that affect climate should be on the same page: That is, carbon neutrality by 2045, as per Governor Brown's 2018 executive order. It makes no sense whatsoever to get to 100 percent zero-carbon electricity “ even on an accelerated basis “ if CalGEM is still handing out new oil and gas drilling permits and has no plan to phase out existing wells. That’s like running in place “ California would be going exactly nowhere in terms of addressing the climate crisis.
