**SUBJECT: CITY OF BURBANK AB 2514 COMPLIANCE FILING REGARDING ENERGY
STORAGE SYSTEMS PROCUREMENT TARGET**

Dear Ms. MacDonald:

Further to your conversation with Scott Mellon on January 5, 2021 and pursuant to the requirements of Assembly Bill (AB) 2514 (Skinner, Chapter 469, Statutes of 2010), City of Burbank hereby submits this report to the California Energy Commission (CEC) to demonstrate Burbank's compliance with energy storage procurement targets and policies adopted by Burbank City Council.

On September 26, 2017, the City Council adopted a motion, in compliance with AB 2514, that selected an energy storage target of zero megawatt for Burbank Water and Power (BWP) to procure by December 31, 2021. This target was primarily selected due to a lack of fully developed, cost-effective energy storage opportunities. As such, a zero megawatt target has been maintained and is currently in effect. A copy of the Staff Report recommending that action is attached.

While no additional energy storage procurement targets have been established at this time, BWP continues to actively explore energy storage systems through its membership in Southern California Public Power Authority (SCPPA) and their related Working Groups. These Working Groups issue annual Requests for Proposal/Information (RFP/RFI) for renewable energy projects and potential storage options. BWP is currently considering several renewable-plus-storage projects as well as individual storage technologies through collaboration with other municipalities in the SCPPA Working Groups.

BWP will continue to consider renewable energy and storage technologies in alignment with our Integrated Resource Plan to provide reliable energy in an affordable and sustainable manner in support of the City of Burbank community.
