On January 15, 2020, the City of Brisbane (City) Department of Public Works (Department) submitted a request (Request) to the California Energy Commission (CEC) seeking exemption for buildings within its jurisdiction from the state Building Energy Benchmarking Program. An exemption may be granted by the CEC Executive Director upon determination that the City's benchmarking program (found in Chapter 15.77 of the Brisbane Municipal Code) meets the requirements of California Code of Regulations, Title 20, Section 1683¹. Pursuant to Section 1684(b)(1), I have reviewed the Request and determined that:

- 1. The City's adopted benchmarking program includes annual public disclosure of the information specified in Section 1684(b)(1)(A)(i).
- The Department has agreed to transmit to the Energy Commission, on behalf of the City, all information that is publicly disclosed for a calendar year by August 1 of the following year, as required by Section 1684(b)(1)(A)(ii).
