The California Energy Commission (CEC) will jointly conduct a workshop with the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) and the California Independent System Operator (CAISO) to initiate a process to explore next steps to plan for the development of resources that will be required to achieve the goals of Senate Bill 100 (SB 100).

The CEC commissioners who will host the workshop are Commissioner Karen Douglas, the CEC's lead commissioner for the Siting, Transmission, and Environmental Protection division, and Commissioner Siva Gunda, the CEC's lead commissioner for the Energy Assessments division. A quorum of CEC commissioners may participate, but no votes will be taken. Commissioners from the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) may also attend.

The workshop will be held remotely, consistent with Executive Orders N-25-20 and N-29-20 and the recommendations from the California Department of Public Health to encourage physical distancing to slow the spread of COVID-19. The public can participate in the workshop consistent with the direction in these executive orders.

Agenda

This workshop will include presentations from the CEC, CPUC, and CAISO covering the current status of resource and transmission planning as well as an overview of the process to consider next steps to plan for the development of renewable and zero-carbon resources and associated transmission.

The workshop will also include panel discussions with other state agencies, California balancing authorities and utility representatives, community leaders, equity advocates, environmental organizations, and other stakeholders.

Background

The 100 Percent Clean Energy Act of 2018 (SB 100, De León, Chapter 312, Statutes of 2018) establishes a target for renewable and zero-carbon resources to supply 100 percent of retail sales and electricity procured to serve all state agencies by 2045. SB 100 requires the CEC, CPUC, and CARB to develop and submit a joint-agency report to the legislature by January 1, 2021, and at least every four years thereafter. The final joint-agency report published on March 15, 2021 recommends that land use information should be updated to reflect the increased resource requirements of SB 100, that the potential impact of emerging resources and technologies need further consideration, and that the social costs and non-energy benefits of land-use impacts, public health and air quality, water supply and quality, economic impacts, and resilience should be integrated into SB 100 planning.

Effectively integrating 100 percent renewable and zero-carbon technologies and achieving carbon neutrality in the state by 2045 will require rigorous analysis of implementation considerations, and coordinated planning across state agencies. Comprehensive and coordinated statewide planning is necessary to ensure that California continues to have a safe and reliable electricity system as new renewable and zero-carbon resources and associated transmission infrastructure is developed, consistent with the state's clean energy and environmental priorities and goals.
